

MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL, VICTOR, IOWA, MAY 14, 2009

The city council met in regular session at city hall at 7:00 P.M. Present were council members Cavin, Robinson, and Simmons. DeNeve and Faga were absent. Mayor Roger Pawlak called the meeting to order.

The third reading of ORDINANCE 312, AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING ON THE STREET AFTER A SNOWFALL was deferred to the next meeting.

Heather Wolf and Jamie York are interested in building a day care facility east of the library. This would involve acquiring land and funding. Perhaps the city and school could make this a joint project. More discussion at the next meeting.

Motion Simmons, second Robinson to auction off the city-owned house at 703 3rd Street on Saturday, June 13 at 10:00 A.M. at city hall. Aye: Robinson, Simmons, Cavin. Nay: none. Motion carried.

Motion Robinson, second Cavin to approve the Hazard Mitigation grant contract with the Department of Homeland Security. Aye: Robinson, Simmons, Cavin. Nay: none. Motion carried.

Traffic is too fast in the alley west of Williams Street. Motion Robinson, second Cavin to barricade the alley to prevent through traffic, but to allow access to the alley from either end. Aye: Robinson, Simmons, Cavin. Nay: none. Motion carried.

The city will mow long grass that is a nuisance under city ordinances at certain designated vacant houses.

Rod Felton talked about a water run off problem and winter ice problem at Coufal Car Care and Victor Car Wash. Felton offered a solution to direct rain water to the west and to pave a portion of the alley. Felton offered to provide the labor and the city to provide the materials estimated at \$3,660. Motion Simmons, second Cavin to approve Felton's proposal. Aye: Robinson, Simmons, Cavin. Nay: none. Motion carried.
